Open Enrollment 2023– Everybody Completes A Form

As mentioned in the last newsletter, employees will have an active enrollment period this year, which means everyone will need to fill out a form - whether you want to keep the same benefits, change to a different plan, or decline benefits. As you have done in the past, you will fill out a form and hand it to your housing authority contact. There will be slight changes to the form, so read it carefully when you receive it from your executive director or HR manager.

Executive directors and HR managers will receive training on SIMON®, the new benefits administration platform provided by **Vimly**. While the platform is built for ease of use, <u>training will be provided for</u> you the **week of October 17th**. Be on the lookout for the calendar invite to attend this training which will be forwarded to you from **Mercer**. Post training, you will have a dedicated **Vimly** customer success team to assist you with additional questions and support needed. You will be sent the contact information for this dedicated team soon.

Check Your Bill Monthly

Please review your bill on the website, IBA 2.0 Login (mercer.com) <u>each</u> <u>month</u>. Examine it carefully each time a change is made, to assure that members are correctly enrolled or terminated. If anything is incorrect, please contact Mercer's Client Services <u>immediately</u> at ClientServices_Billing3@mercer.com. With the exception of Texas which does not allow retro terminations, <u>any mistakes found can only be corrected</u> up to 60 days back, no matter when the error occurred or who made it.

Timely Bill Payments Required

Housing authorities that fail to pay their bill within the 60-day grace period will be terminated for non-payment.

2023 Benefit & Rate Information

Housing authorities should be watching for an Open Enrollment email from Mercer. Each of you should be receiving this 2023 benefit and rate information in early October.

Transparency in Coverage

Under the "Transparency in Coverage" rules, HBP's insurer, United Healthcare (UHC), is required to make public certain "machinereadable files" showing (1) in-network negotiated payment rates, (2) historical out-of-network allowed amounts, and (3) in-network rates and historical costs for prescription drugs. (NOTE: The requirement to provide this third file is not yet effective). As required UHC has posted these files on their website. For your convenience, the link to the "machinereadable files" is provided below and also on the Links page of HBP's website.

The files you are looking for on this site are files 51503 and 51504, UnitedHealthcare Insurance Company Choice plus. Keep in mind that these files can be up to one terabyte in size, so system capacity and memory should be checked before downloading them. They are machine readable JSON files, not easily interpreted or searchable. To open them you may need to search for free applications supporting the download and viewing of JSON files. This can be a time consuming, difficult task. You may prefer to wait for a member-friendly consumer price transparency tool that will be available in 2023 and 2024.
