#### THE BENEFIT

Housing Benefits Plan (HBP) is the medical plan provided to you by your housing authority. It is directed by housing authority Executive Directors from across Southeast and Southwest NAHRO for the benefit of housing authorities.

Please share this with all of your HBP employees, retirees, and COBRA members. Also share with the ED, HR, and Finance.

#### **Tier 1 Provider**

Tier 1 providers refer to healthcare providers that are part of the insurance plan's network and typically offer the highest level of coverage and lower out-of-pocket costs for policyholders. For UnitedHealthcare, Tier 1 providers are in-network providers that UHC has negotiated rates with. Using these providers often results in lower deductibles, co-pays, and coinsurance for members, compared to out-of-network or Tier 2 and Tier 3 providers, where the costs may be higher. As a member of UHC, you can save money by choosing Tier 1 providers for your healthcare needs. These providers are often primary care doctors, specialists, hospitals and other healthcare facilities that UHC works closely with to provide cost-effective services. 
